





































## **Upcoming Michigan PSI Events**

The two-day course, taught by expert and engaging faculty, uses a thorough, evidence-based curriculum designed for psychiatrists, nurses, physicians, social workers, mental health providers, childbirth professionals, social support providers, and other providers of color who want in building skills for assessment and treatment of perinatal mood disorders.

#### Upon completion of this course, the participant will be able to:

- Identify the challenges faced when identifying and treating perinatal mood and anxiety disorders.
- Describe the symptoms and understand the differential diagnosis of prenatal and postpartum depression, anxiety, panic disorder, OCD, PTSD, bipolar disorders and psychosis.
- Discuss psychopharmacology as it relates to pregnancy, postpartum, and lactation.
- 4. Assess prenatal and postpartum risk factors.
- Assess for perinatal mood and anxiety disorders.
- Identify treatment options for perinatal mood disorders (PMDs).
- Discuss breastfeeding and PMDs.
- 8. Develop psychosocial and self-help treatment plans as well as appropriate psychotherapy techniques and alternative therapies.
- State appropriate psychotherapy modalities.
- Indicate consequences of untreated PMDs.
- 11. Discuss effects and consequences on partners.
- 12. Identify social support, legislative changes, and community resources, including how to set up support groups and offer social support.
- Discuss cultural differences and PMDs.
- 14. Discuss spirituality and PMDs.

**Angelene Love-Adams** 

Angelene Love-Adams wears multiple crowns to wrap her community individualized support, to reduce the maternal and infant mortality rates for Black and Brown birthing people. She is a lactation supporter, equity advocate and full-spectrum doula. She earned her Bachelor of Science in Health Education from Eastern Michigan University and is currently pursuing a Master's in Public Health Education and a Certified Lactation Counselor certification. Angelene works diligently to identify, create, and strengthen partnerships with community individuals, grassroots organizations and systems to effect change centering the Black families who have been systematically oppressed.

Angelene is the Human Milk Transport Coordinator for Mama's Mobile Milk, a free program that delivers human milk from mothers to their separated babies around Michigan, including separation due to encaration. Additionally, she is the co-owner of Wrapped in Love Doula & Lactation Services, an organization that aims to support families in their birth and beyond journey by wrapping them in love, advocacy, support and education every step of the way, also providing equity and community collaboration consulting.

Angelene recently and enthusiastically stepped into the role of Program Director for the Survivor Moms' Companion program. This is a psychoeducation program that supports birthing people navigate childhood maltreatment and trauma that may resurface during the perinatal period and early parenting, by connecting families with culturally congruent tutors to walk alongside them during their healing journey. In this new role Angelene is prioritizing weaving equity into the framework of the program to ensure the needs of all families are me. She believes that with new insight and lived experience she brings to the program it will grow, flourish and scale to reach more families outside of Michigan.



The Survivor Moms' Companion (SMC) Program has been given the opportunity to provide this training to doulas and MIHP workers in specific regions at zero investment. This has been a great fit for many as doulas provide near peer support. Doulas are often already in client homes and are a safe space for clients to go through the program. However we find that clients need to have support from all birth and beyond professionals so we invite all birth adjacent professionals to attend our training. The parent company to SMC Growing Forward Together also provides additional support and training like; assistance with referring to the program, professional development and more. **Check out our website-survivormoms.org**
